

Inputting Accurate Wattage

When entering existing equipment on your Electronic Lighting Worksheet, it is imperative that the accurate wattage is indicated. Service Providers who are found to be entering inaccurate existing wattage values are subject to disciplinary action, up to and including program expulsion.

Accuracy Starts With the Lighting Audit

The existing equipment wattage needs to be reported accurately on the Electronic Lighting Worksheet at the time of the application submission. Verify the on-site lamp wattage and ballast factor during your lighting audit. If the existing equipment is in a location that is difficult to examine, talk to the maintenance staff, check the replacement equipment in storage, or review a replacement equipment invoice to ensure accurate wattage is reported. Getting wattage incorrect can lead to customer satisfaction issues, incentive changes and inaccurate savings calculations. In the long run, it is always more efficient to get wattage right at the beginning of a job.

Consequences

Inaccurate data provided on an application or discovered during an inspection will result in delayed application processing times, increased inspections on future projects and possibly restrictions on program participation.
